

Wang Bing

Wang Bing is one of China's most acclaimed documentary filmmakers, renowned for his portraits of marginalized lives and the transformations of modern China; his work has earned major festival awards and international acclaim. Trained in photography at the Lu Xun Academy of Fine Art and cinematography at the Beijing Film Academy, he began working independently in 1999. His nine-hour West of Tracks (2003) brought international recognition, followed by Fengming, A Chinese Memoir; Three Sisters; 'Til Madness Do Us Part; Mrs. Fang; and Dead Souls—films that probe memory, poverty, and survival with intimate, durational observation. In 2023 he released Youth (Spring), a documentary on young people in a town in Yunnan Province, praised for its authentic, poignant direction.

Huang Lu

Huang Lu, known as the 'Queen of Chinese Art-house Film,' has starred in acclaimed works such as *Blind Mountain*, *Blind Massage*, and *Dog Days*. The only post-80s Chinese actress with films selected at Cannes, Berlin, and Venice, she is celebrated internationally for her daring, nuanced performances.





Cheng-Sim Lim

Cheng-Sim Lim is a Los Angeles—based curator and Asia Delegate for the San Sebastián International Film Festival. Formerly Co-Head of Programming at UCLA Film & Television Archive and Artistic Director of the China Onscreen Biennial, she has championed non-Western cinema in the U.S. and curated globally acclaimed retrospectives such as Heroic Grace: The Chinese Martial Arts Film.



Inge de Leeuw

Inge de Leeuw is an awardwinning programmer and curator with over 15 years of experience, currently Director of Programming at Metrograph in New York and formerly senior programmer at IFFR. She has curated internationally across film, art, and digital culture, and was named Best **Emerging Programmer at** Cannes (2019) and one of Screen International's Future Leaders (2017)

Jordan Cronk

Jordan Cronk is a Los Angeles-based critic, programmer, and founder of Acropolis Cinema. He contributes to Artforum, Film Comment, and MUBI Notebook, and serves as a program advisor for Quinzaine des Cinéastes.



After his wife's sudden death, Shu Wen struggled to recover. A year later, he considered a new romance, but his daughters disagreed. This led to a communication opportunity, making Shu Wen aware of his past "absence" in the family. He shifted his focus to those around him and realized that he was not as useless as he had thought. As he reintegrated into the family, differences and conflicts arising from varying social statuses within the family became apparent. While the middle generation appeared harmonious, their regrets and struggles were reflected in the younger generation. As a "bystander" in the family, Shu Wen keenly observed this and took it upon himself to heal his loved ones in his own unique way. In doing so, he not only reestablished the family bond but also found solace for himself.



YANG Suiyi

KARST is my debut film project. The story takes place in my hometown, Qiandongnan, Guizhou Province, China, which is where I grew up. This region boasts a unique karst landscape. When I decided to film here, it made me reflect on the people living in this area.

In a rural village, far from the city, located in the karst region of the plateau in southwestern China, Ziying is a woman who earns her livelihood by raising cattle. When Ziying's cattle falls ill and the village clinic is unable to provide treatment, she seeks medical advice at the town's agricultural pharmacy. She then accompanies the veterinarian back to the village. During her visits to the clinic, Ziying also reconnects with her childhood friend Shufen and her lover Yinde, the experience of these few days has reminded her of her past stories...



JING Yi

The story takes place in a forgotten valley village on the northern border of Xinjiang, China. The entire film features non-actors, a first person perspective, and a visual presentation that blends documentary with fiction, all attempting to evoke an alternative reality.

The Kazakh-ethnicity people, as a nomadic group, believe that the souls of the deceased dwell in the grass. If the ultimate belonging of those living on the border is to peacefully reside in the world of plants, then my original intention of making this film is to give my simple blessing to the forgotten people and land, the departed people and events.

Set in a remote village in Xinjiang, China, THE BOTANIST follows a young Kazakh boy named Arsin, who finds solace in the company of plants. He soon meets Meiyu, a spirited Han girl whose unpredictable nature reminds him of a rare, otherworldly plant. As their friendship blossoms, it deepens into a delicate, dreamlike allegory that blurs the lines between reality and the enchanting world of botany.

A coastal city in Brazil, Kai arrives from Taiwan for holidays with a broken heart. A broken air conditioner sends her into Fu Ang's umbrella store. He could become a friend, but the rainy season doesn't arrive and his shop disappears. While looking for Fu Ang, Kai discovers the story of Xiaoxin and a group of Chinese workers in a posh skyscraper. Kai finds herself strangely mirrored in Xiaoxin's tale.

Performed by first time actors and professional ones, the protagonists of this quiet comedy of misunderstandings come and go unexpectedly. From one unknown city to the next, they follow the needs of their work more than a traditional dramaturgy. But over the course of a hot, slow summer, delicate bonds grow between them like islands in a sea full of sharks.

I made my last film with Chinese nonprofessional actors in Buenos Aires. We
shot it entirely on the weekends, because





Deng Guiying and Yang Qiaoyuan have been separated for more than thirty years, and they have settled down in one south and one north of their respective units. The two people with vastly different personalities argued as soon as they met, and they finally divorced at the age of eighty. Nevertheless, Deng Guiying occasionally visits Yang Qiaoyuan. Under the curiosity and step-by-step exploration of their granddaughter, the dusty past and the overlooked inner side of each of them were gradually uncovered. As time passed, Deng Guiying developed Alzheimer's disease and her memory deteriorated. Yang Qiaoyuan also passed away in 2017. At the end of her life and memories, Deng Guiying forgot many things, including the conflicts she had with her husband.



Nestled in the centre of Hong Kong, the neighbourhood of Hung Hom is a study in contradictions. While the dead are transported to the nearby funeral homes, the living crowd its bustling streets. The affluent live in luxury residences towering over dilapidated buildings marked for demolition, while the poor sift through construction waste and trash for a meagre living wage. Capturing the ebb and flow of this urban district over a five-year period, Wong Siu-pong's latest observational documentary provokes thoughtful discussion at a time when waste disposal has become a hot-button issue. 'Obedience' questions what is truly considered waste in this city.




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My journey began in 2017, nine years after the announcement of the new railway project, which later soared from HK\$30B to 100B, leaving old buildings and many homes neglected. Amidst the backdrop of skyscrapers and the stream of visitors to the Kwun Yum Temple, I witnessed the harsh realities of the neighborhood. I became deeply intrigued by the intricate relationship between the residents and the process of discarding, offering a unique lens into the socio-economic and cultural dynamics of Hong Kong.



He tries to integrate and is eventually accepted, but then discovers they are gay and suspects his son might be too. Angered, he leaves. However, past encounters and memories lead him to a change of heart, and he chooses to return to the park once more.

First, her daughter developed liver fibrosis; then her father's Alzheimer's disease progressed to its advanced stages; and finally, her husband was diagnosed with cancer.

Yet Feng remained optimistic. At an anniversary event, an unexpected reunion with her ex-husband stirred memories that reveal her past—and the roots of her resilience.

In 1945, the Second World War has ended but the tranquil is short-lived. The four sons of the Lin family have become unwitting witnesses to history through their own life stories.

Wen-hsiung, the eldest son, supports his young family with a fledgling business. Wen-lung, the second brother, has not returned from the frontlines while the third brother Wen-liang survived the war, only to be severely traumatised. The youngest son, Wen-ching, is a deaf photographer. Although the latter could have lived a quaint life with his best friend's sister, Hiromi, he is compelled to join the resistance against political tyranny. A City of Sadness is the first Taiwanese film to touch upon the February 28 Incident.



Jia Zhangke's debut is ground zero for his modern-China project: non-actors, 16mm grain, long takes, and a quietly shattering final image. The World Cinema Project's new 4K restoration, which is from the original camera and sound negatives, supervised by Jia, returns the film's tactile immediacy. Critics have long praised its humane, observational power; Peter Bradshaw called it "engrossing" with a "compassionate walking pace." Essential context for Jia's entire body of work.

Tsui Hark's ravishing 1993 classic Green Snake returns in a stunning 4K restoration. Reimagining the White Snake legend through the eyes of the mischievous younger sister (Maggie Cheung), Tsui transforms myth into a sensual parable of desire, dogma, and belonging. A rare chance to see this color-saturated landmark of Hong Kong cinema on the big screen, the way it was meant to be experienced. Two snake spirits become human and learn about love and suffering. 9H 11M Marathon Screening

We begin the marathon screening at 10:00 am with Part I: Rust, divided into two sessions. The first runs about two hours, followed by a short 15-minute break. The second half of Rust plays from 12:15 pm to 2:15 pm, leading directly into a 45-minute lunch break.

At 3:00 pm, we continue with Part II: Remnants (176 minutes). A 20-minute pause at 5:56 pm allows for a quick rest before the final stretch.

The program concludes with Part III: Rails (135 minutes), screening from 6:16 pm to 8:31 pm. Followed by an IN PERSON Q&A with Wang Bing.





Wang Bing's nine-hour epic of Shenyang's rust-belt factories is one of contemporary cinema's foundational documentaries. Sight & Sound describes it as a "monumental threnody to twentieth-century industry," and in the BFI poll of the 50 Greatest Documentaries, it ranks among the top entries. To see it with the director on stage is a rare chance to encounter a film that literally rewrote the scale and ethics of documentary practice.

Awarded Best Film in the Un Certain Regard section at Cannes, Black Dog is the story of two outsiders. After a long prison sentence, Lang returns to his hometown on the edge of the Gobi Desert in north-western China. In the lead-up to the 2008 Olympic Games, everything is in a state of upheaval — buildings are slated for demolition, and efforts are underway to eliminate the town's stray dogs which traipse along sidewalks, skulk inside condemned buildings, and snarl at residents. Haunted by the victims of his past crimes, Lang finds work as a dog catcher. Oscillating between melancholy and humor, Black Dog is a bold combination of whimsy and social realism.




About The Director
